THE SOCIAL DISTILLERY

A small island off the far northwestern coast of Scotland, the Isle of Harris is home to a community of less than 2,000 people. In 2015, Isle of Harris Distillery was created to provide **sustainable employment** for generations to come by sharing this special place with the world.

MADE IN OUR ISLAND HOME

Every drop of the **award-wining Isle of Harris Gin** is made in the small village of Tarbert. The **small copper gin still** is nicknamed *'The Dotach'* in honor of a similarly small and feisty local woman who is fondly remembered in Harris.

The gin uses **nine botanicals**, including locally-harvested **Sugar Kelp seaweed**, which lends a subtle coastal freshness to the spirit.

The gin is presented in a beautiful glass bottle, ribbed and rippled like the sea. The paper label holds flecks of Sugar Kelp and copper, each one different with over 20 unique iterations.

NO HEADS OR TAILS

No effort or expense is spared in making Isle of Harris Gin the best it can be. The distillers discard, instead of recycling the inferior **heads** and **tails** of the spirit run, **bottling only the purest heart**. The result is a **luxuriously smooth and complex** spirit of superior quality, perfect to sip on its own, enjoy over ice or in a classic Martini.
