AMBERVALE SINGLE VINEYARD SERIES



The slopes of the Ambervale vineyard form a natural amphitheatre that is the foundation of this treasured vineyard. The embracing hillsides have created many distinct microsites, each planted to capture the essence of its location.



TARRAWATTA sits in the Barossa Ranges, a wild and rolling band of hills that forms the Eastern edge of the Barossa Valley. The view from the top of its many hills seems endless, its colossal ancient red gum trees look small from above. Small parcels of vines will be planted in only the best sites to protect the property's natural beauty.

Hailing from the Eden Valley, Tarrawatta embodies the remarkable quality found in the coveted region where some of the world's best red wines are grown. Part of the Barossa wine region, the higher-altitude Eden Valley produces wines of complexity, elegance with excellent aromatics from some of the world's oldest vines.

TARRAWATA 'AMBERVALE' SHIRAZ 2018

"I loved the 2018 Shiraz Ambervale. This is classic Shiraz done with elegance and purity as well as richness. Lots of ripe blackberry fruits, chocolate, mint, damp earth, and violet notes define the bouquet, and it's full-bodied and brilliantly balanced, with ripe tannins and notable freshness. It's a gem of a wine to enjoy over the coming 7-8 years."

TARRAWATA 'AMBERVALE' CABERNET SAUVIGNON 2018

"Plenty of classic Cabernet current and cassis fruits as well as a complex underbelly of cedarwood, forest floor, tobacco, and violets. These all carry to a medium to full-bodied Cabernet Sauvignon with beautiful purity of fruit, ripe and certainly present tannins, and a solid spine of acidity that's going to keep this evolving nicely for 10-15 years."
